




Neighborhood Boundary

 south.






Community-Driven Initiative

People


Cavile Place residents are supported and thriving throughout the community's transformation, invited to return to new, mixed-income properties







- 300-unit public housing community that opened in 1954
- Needed \$42 million in repairs; received Section 18 Demolition approval in 2019
- Residents relocated using Tenant Protection Vouchers to homes of choice throughout the city
- MBS released RFQ for Abatement & Demolition Contractor in June





Future Opportunities (2020-2025)






